


Activities for children


Each activity will help children practise at least one of the skills we test in our Cambridge English: Young Learners tests – reading and writing, listening or speaking. They also include words taken from the word lists used to create these exams.

If you're not sure what level your child is at, it may be a good idea to start with the <u>Pre-A1 level activities</u>. If these are too easy they can move up through the levels to <u>A1 level activities</u> and/or <u>A2 level activities</u>.

These activities are designed to be used on a desktop or tablet.

Write & Improve is a free tool for learners of English. Write & Improve uses new technology developed at the University of Cambridge to mark English writing accurately, in seconds.

It is simple to use: just choose a task, write or upload a written response and use the feedback to quickly improve.

The score is aligned to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) and also shows you how to improve spelling, grammar and vocabulary.

Kahoot!




Speak & Improve


Exam Lift






